

Isle of Capri Casino is Proud to Reinvest in Bettendorf, Scott County and Iowa.

Isle of Capri Casino pays a variety of taxes that are paid to the State General Fund; local transient guest tax fund with disbursement to the local government imposing the tax, and to local sales and service tax fund with disbursement to local jurisdictions.

© SCRA

The SCRA is a non-profit corporation that distributes gaming revenues received from Isle of Capri Casino. Funds are distributed to educational institutions, governmental and qualified non-profit organizations through a grant process.

© City of Bettendorf

The City of Bettendorf receives on average 1.8 - 1.9 million dollars per year from Isle of Capri Casino. The Family Aquatics Center has been a 1.6 million dollar project our tax dollars have gone to. Also, an indoor lap pool for \$900,000. The removal of the downtown lime pile (\$440,000) and road projects such as the Belmont Road have also benefitted from Isle of Capri tax dollars.

© Scott County

Scott County allocates all of the money they receive from Isle of Capri Casino to capital improvements (one time projects). Currently they are working on a ten year project to remodel the Court House and Bicentennial Building. The administrative offices will all be moved out of the Court House and to the Bicentennial Building so that the Court House will only house court/law enforcement activities. They are also getting ready to begin renovations on the Juvenile Detention Center.

© Iowa Gambling Treatment Fund

The Iowa Gambling Treatment Fund uses the money for the actual treatment, education, public information and awareness, and to support their help line.
