Southeast Iowa Regional Riverboat Commission

The City of Keokuk and the Keokuk Area Convention and Tourism Bureau again, wish to take this opportunity to highlight the many areas that are impacted by our portion of the discretionary funding provided through Southeast Iowa Regional Riverboat Commission. The twelve months of operations in 2012 produced over \$400,000,00 in revenues that were very critical to the City of Keokuk's budget. The funds made possible many current and ongoing projects that otherwise would have been underfunded or would have been delayed. This will summarize many of those projects and accomplishments.

- Assisted in the budget of Keokuk Area Convention and Tourism which organizes and supports community events such as Eagle Days, Civil War Reenactment, Mississippi Power Days, Rollin on the River Blues Festival, Geode Fest and many more. All of the local events draw thousands of visitors each year that add to our Tri-State and local area economies. The 2012 events were successful in producing an estimated \$275,000 in hotel/motel taxes. The occupancy tax revenue is used for promoting our Tri-State Area Tourism.
- Provided the City the ability to improve its firefighting capabilities through purchases of new apparatus and related equipment.
- Invested start-up capital for economic development projects that show potential for creating jobs and industrial growth in Keokuk and Lee County.
- Assistance in the Keokuk Union Depot project and general maintenance of the surrounding area.
- Corridor, street and sidewalk improvements.
- Continued rehabilitation and upgrades to several City parks and recreational areas including Walking/Bike Trails, High School Tennis Courts, Victory Park, Joyce Park, Rees Park, and the George M. Verity Museum .
- Supported the reconstruction of the Keokuk Airport Runway project.

The City of Keokuk, the Tourism Bureau and the Keokuk SIRRC Commissioners express our sincere gratitude in being a part of and sharing in the financial resources provided through Southeast Iowa Regional Riverboat Commission and the Catfish gaming operations. The funds continue to play an important role in our budgeting process, community events and vital City projects.

Historical Accomplishments

Acquired 300 acres of well situated real estate, worked with the City of Burlington and West Burlington to develop necessary infrastructure, marketed and sold approximately 180 acres to businesses ranging from heavy manufacturing to retail. The assessed valuation in Flint Ridge Business Park now totals more than \$23 million, with property taxes generating more than \$957,000 per year.

Since inception, the organization has provided over \$1.14 million in community investments to enhance the community's quality of life. Funding recipients have included: RecPlex, Community Field, Frisbee Golf Courses, RiverPark Place, Grade A Plus, riverfront improvements, the Community Foundation of Des Moines County and the Beaverdale Highway Exchange, among others.
