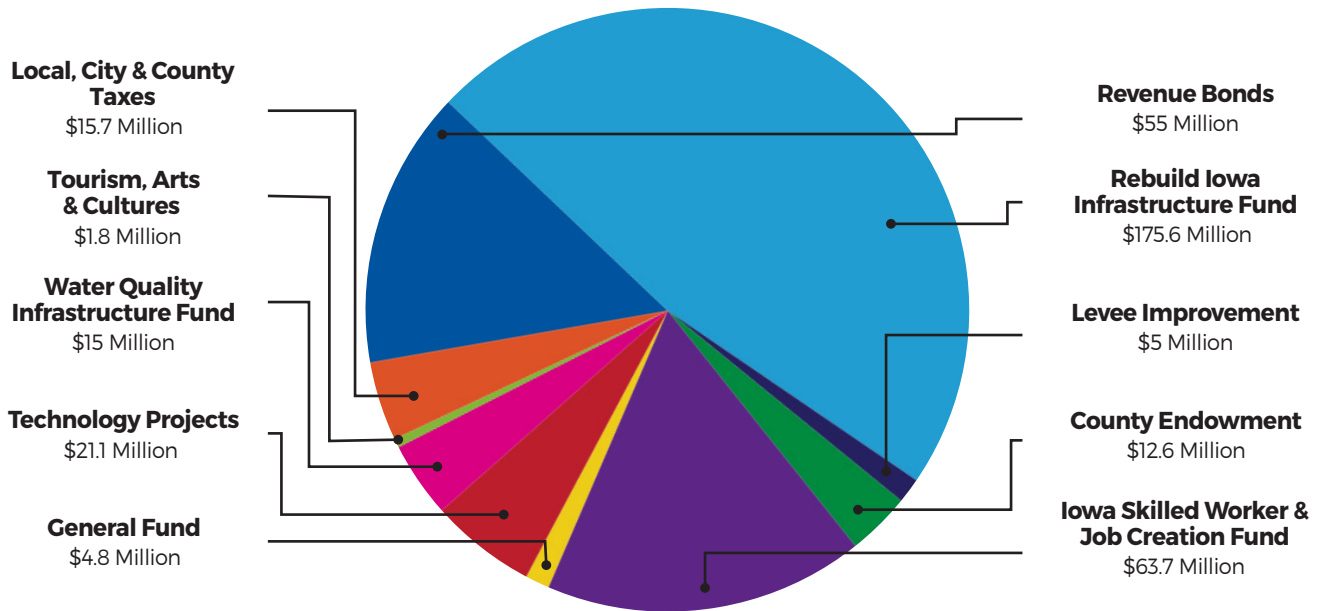


Gaming Revenues Benefit Iowa

Distribution of FY 2025 Gaming Revenues. Total = \$354.6 Million*



Tourism Marketing and Arts & Culture \$1.8 Million

Gaming revenues are allocated to the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) to support tourism promotion and the preservation of Iowa's arts and cultural resources.



Revenue Bonds \$55 Million***

Gaming funds are used to pay the debt service on revenue bonds issued in 2009 and 2010. Net proceeds totaling \$695 million were used for various infrastructure projects.



Iowa Skilled Worker & Job Creation Fund \$63.8 Million

Each year, a dedicated portion of tax revenue goes to the Iowa Skilled Worker & Job Creation Fund. The money is appropriated each year by the General Assembly for job training and job creation programs at the Board of Regents, Iowa Workforce Development, Department of Education, Economic Development Authority and College Student Aid.



Water Quality Infrastructure Fund \$15 Million

Gaming revenue helps support projects that improve water quality. Funds support projects for the installation of infrastructure, including conservation structures, practices, or other measures that reduce nutrient loads, associated sediment, or contaminants from sources to surface waters that are used as a drinking water supply.

Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund \$175.6 Million**

RIIF funds support critical infrastructure projects statewide, including agriculture and land stewardship, public safety, economic development, public defense, state university facilities, technology initiatives and more.

County Endowment \$12.6 Million

The County Endowment Program is funded by an allocation of 0.8% of the state's commercial gaming tax revenue (specifically the tax on adjusted gross receipts from gambling games). Funds are distributed annually to the community foundations in the 84 counties without a casino.



Local, City & County Taxes \$15.7 Million

Cities and counties with a commercial gaming facility receive 0.5% each (total 1%) of the casino's adjusted gross receipts (AGR) annually.

* The gaming industry pays an additional \$19.6 million to the state for regulatory-related costs associated with the Department of Public Safety and the Iowa Racing and Gaming Commission.

** \$3.8 Million of wagering tax revenue is first allocated to the Federal Subsidy Holdback Fund that will help pay the debt service on the 2009 Revenue Bonds if the federal subsidy on the Build America Bonds is not received. Once the subsidy is received, that amount is transferred to the RIIF.

*** Anything unneeded for debt service on revenue bonds transfers back to the RIIF.

MORE THAN \$1 BILLION IN ANNUAL ECONOMIC IMPACT



Iowa's casino industry generates more than \$1 billion in annual economic impact, supporting employee wages, Iowa-based purchasing, charitable contributions, and state and local taxes. As a vital part of Iowa's gaming and entertainment sector, casinos play a meaningful role in strengthening the state's economy. Gaming revenues help fund infrastructure, tourism, cultural attractions, and community projects across Iowa. From creating opportunities for Iowa-based vendors to compete for business, to supporting natural resource conservation and other public priorities, Iowa's gaming industry is about more than entertainment. It is about giving back, investing in Iowa's future, and supporting communities statewide.

Positive Impact for Iowans



Buy Iowa First

Iowa's commercial casinos are committed to supporting Iowa businesses by purchasing goods and services from Iowa-based vendors. Last year, 89.88 % of Iowa's commercial casinos' total expenditures on products and services were with Iowa-based businesses.

Iowa Agriculture

Iowa's commercial casinos support Iowa's agricultural industry by purchasing millions of pounds of beef, chicken and turkey, thousands of gallons of milk, and several million eggs yearly.

Charitable Giving

Iowa's commercial casinos benefit worthy organizations in all 99 Iowa counties. Whether a county is home to a commercial casino or not, it can apply for grants through qualified charitable organizations.

Each of Iowa's 19 commercial casinos partners with a nonprofit or qualified sponsoring organization. A portion of gaming revenue is reinvested annually to support charitable and civic needs across Iowa communities.

The County Endowment Fund Program gives a portion of Iowa's gaming tax revenue to community foundations in the 84 counties **without a state gaming license**. Each foundation uses 75% of the funds for local charitable projects and puts the remaining 25% into a permanent endowment.

Since the County Endowment Fund Program began in 2004, 38,745 grants have been made to invest \$160 million in nonprofits across Iowa.

Strengthening Iowa Tourism and Community Impact

Iowa's commercial casinos serve as tourism-focused entertainment hubs that attract visitors from beyond their local communities. These visitors support Iowa's broader tourism economy by spending on recreation, lodging, dining, and entertainment, helping drive economic activity across the state. Casino-linked events and attractions further boost local tourism by increasing overnight stays and visitor spending. In addition, gaming tax revenues help fund community and state projects that strengthen tourism and improve visitor-ready amenities throughout Iowa.

The Iowa Gaming Association (IGA) is the statewide trade association of Iowa's commercial casino entertainment industry and its related partners.
